Private Pilot Training Course

A private helicopter pilot license (PPL) allows a pilot to fly a helicopter and carry passengers. Although not for compensation or hire, operating expenses may be shared with other passengers.

Requirements to Begin Training

- 1. There is no age limit to start the PPL training. However the student must be at least 16 years of age to solo, and at least 17 years old obtain the certificate.
- 2. Be able to read, speak, write and understand the English language

Examinations and Practical tests

The following tests and examinations will be required:

- 1. FAA Medical Certificate
- 2. PPL Knowledge test
- 3. PPL Practical test (Oral & Flight Test)

Additional Cost

Books and Supplies, Medical Certificate, FAA Knowledge Test, FAA practical Test / Examiner fee, FAA Practical Test – 1.5 hour Aircraft Rental, Insurance Deductible, Enrollment Fee

Completion time

Full Time – 4-6 weeks (full time assume 6 days/week and 4-6 hours training per day)
